5.	We can pretty confidently predict that most Christians would not say what Jesus said to John in 11:46 if someone asked us what Jesus came to do. Part of the reason may be that we have the rest of the story, parts that Jesus was not yet ready to reveal to everyone. But if his answer isn't even on our radar, what blind spots might that reveal in our collective understanding of Christ's work?

6. What do you think is Jesus's primary point in 11:11-15? Don't just give your opinion; provide a studied answer. For some help in doing so, check out the notes in at least two good Study Bibles like the NIV Study Bible or the ESV Study Bible.
